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### Introduction

Hamilton County Schools has approved and authorizes nine charter schools in the district. Each school has a unique approach and strives to educate some of the district's most vulnerable students. The Charter School Coordinator works under the direction of the Office of Opportunity and Access, Department of Access and School Choice. Through open communication and transparency, there is a clear line from each charter to the support they need in the various district departments.

#### In 22-23

- Four charter schools Received Level 5 TVAAS scores for the 22-23 school year; Chattanooga Prep, CGLA, CCSE Elementary and CCSE Middle.
- Chatt Prep expanded to a CMO with the approval of Knox Prep.
- Ivy's Skillern Elementary opened their new campus, housing grades 1-2.
- Chatt Academy Community School requested a one-year deferral due to location issues and will enroll students for the 24-25 school year.
- In 2022-2023, several charter schools joined the HCS School Choice lottery process for the first time.

# **Section 5 Performance**

Hamilton County Schools continues to grow and mature as a charter school authorizer in the state of Tennessee. The district is currently a mid-sized authorizer with 9 approved charter schools. Over the past year, there have been many improvements in the office of Access and School Choice regarding charter school policy and procedures.

- HCS maintained exacting standards by fairly and completely evaluating each charter school it
  oversees using the adopted HCS Framework for Evaluation. There were no new applications
  to review in 22-23. No school closures were necessary.
- HCS upheld school autonomy by allowing the schools freedom in all areas of charter administration, while providing specific support and accountability where necessary.
- HCS protected student and public interests by holding schools accountable for their
  admissions policies and processes, disciplinary procedures, and for services provided to
  students under state and federal law, including ELL and those with disabilities. As an
  authorizer, all state laws were followed, and the district followed all state requirements. The
  district includes information regarding choice of charter schools on public sites and
  publications.
- The HCS school board is educated annually regarding charter law and obligations as a charter authorizer. Amendments and board policy were implemented in 22-23 to strengthen the work of the charter office in Access and School Choice, including the adoption of the HCS Framework for Evaluation, the Policy for School Intervention, and the Policy for Renewal of a Charter School. Each department that serves charter schools (finance, data & accountability, operations & safety, federal programs) is committed to serving effectively and with transparency.
- HCS did not have a new applicant in 22-23, but two existing schools expanded and welcomed Hamilton County students. The newest charter school, serving students whose primary language is not English, deferred for a year and is planning to open in 2024.
- The first Authorizer Evaluation conducted by the state in 2021 resulted in a Plan of Improvement for HCS. The second Authorizer Evaluation just completed in 2023 and that will be finalized in February 2024, showed marked progress and no plan of improvement is necessary.
